



## Cascadia Water Trail Campsites

### **Anna Smith** *The Mid-Sound Area*

A delight 7.5-acre park with a great view of the Olympic Mountains. While you're there, visit the Master Gardeners' demonstration site at the top of the hill. On one of the most protected bodies of water on the Cascadia Marine Trail, you can venture to Silverdale or Bremerton easily.

#### Natural History.

Anna Smith's Gardens, established in 1987, serve as an educational site for Kitsap County gardeners. Here you'll find side by side comparison plantings of small fruits and vegetables as well as spectacular displays of flowers, rockery plants, and drought tolerant ornamentals. The Master Gardener regularly conduct new variety trials and demonstrate methods for extending growing seasons.
