Fort Flagler State Park *The North Sound Area*

With views in many directions, Fort Flagler is well known as a place for great photographic opportunities. Walk over a mile on the beach, visit the historic lighthouse and watch the seals play in the blue waters of Admiralty Inlet. Mount Baker and Port Townsend are part of the visual attractions of this park.

Natural History.

Fort Flagler, along with the heavy batteries of Fort Warden and Fort Casey, once guarded the nautical entrance to Puget Sound. These posts, established in the late 1890's, became the first line of fortification system designed to prevent a hostile fleet from reaching targets such as the Bremerton Naval Yard. Fort Flagler is named after Brigadier General Daniel Webster Flagler.
