



## Cascadia Water Trail Campsites



### Fort Worden State Park *In the Northern Area*

Take a walk along the 11,000 feet of beach or hike up the bluffs to take in a bird's eye view at the entrance to Puget Sound. Be sure to take a flashlight and explore the haunted house-like maze of the underground passageways. Port Townsend is a popular destination and the park hosts many conferences, including the annual West Coast Sea Kayak Symposium.

#### *Natural History.*

Mingle with intertidal plants and animals indigenous to Puget Sound at the Port Townsend Marine Science Center. The Marine exhibit at the end of the pier houses touch pools and aquaria highlighting local marine habitats. On shore, the Natural History exhibit highlights aspects of the shoreline, including a 12 foot model of a Puget Sound bluff.
