



Cascadia Water Trail Campsites



Joemma Beach State Park *The South Sound Area*

Enjoy 3,000 feet of public shoreline or explore several short hiking trails that wind through the park's 22 acres of coastal forest. The campsites sit above the picnic shelters, a short walk up from the park's ramp and dock.

Natural History.

This property was granted to Washington at statehood in 1889 for the support of common schools. The original recreation site was developed beginning in 1961 and was named Robert F. Kennedy Recreation Area on opening day in 1968. The property was transferred to State parks in 1995 and was renamed "Joemma Beach State park" after Joe and Emma Smith, who lived on the premises from 1917 to 1932.

Sand and large gravel below bulkhead. Plan on landing next to boat ramp so you can pull your boat up the ramp and store it on grassy area north of the ramp.
