



Cascadia Water Trail Campsites



Lighthouse Park *The North Sound Area*

From the northernmost site on the Cascadia Marine Trail you can look south to Canada's Cabbage, Tumbo, and Saturna Islands across the Strait of Georgia. Point Roberts is the tip of a peninsula and cut off from the continental United States, requiring four border crossings if you were to visit by land.

Natural History.

Enjoy the 20-foot high observation tower. During summer months orcas and other whales may swim by. This is a good spot for birding. Point Roberts became American when the Oregon Treaty of 1846 created a boundary "westward along the said forth-ninth parallel of north latitude to the middle of the channel which separates the continent from Vancouver's Island." No lighthouse remains here now, but plans are afoot to build one worthy of the park's name.
