



Cascadia Water Trail Campsites

Meadowdale *The Mid-Sound Area*

Once a country club, this park is now a haven for wildlife. Migrating waterfowl visit in the spring and fall; you may see seals, sea lions, bald eagles, and occasional river otters. Meadowdale is one of the few Cascadia Marine Trail sites on the populous east shore of central Puget Sound.

Natural History.

Meadowdale's gulch area passed through several owners before it became a park. The first person to homestead the site was John Lund in 1878. The site was eventually acquired by Meadowdale Terrace. The well tended private park featured a clubhouse, manicured lawns, an Olympic-sized swimming pool with bathhouse, and a fish hatchery. The country club closed in the 1960's.
