### Narrows Park *The South Sound Area*

The Narrows Park is a safe haven at the midpoint of the Tacoma Narrows. At night it's great to watch the vehicle lights on the Narrows Bridges from the serenity of the park. The white dome of Mt. Rainier is visible over Tacoma, especially on moonlit evenings.

#### *Natural History.*

The remains of the first Narrows bridge, Galloping Gertie, at the bottom of this waterway are said to be prime habitat for octopi. The former bridge was paced on the National Register of Historic Places in 1992.
