



## Cascadia Water Trail Campsites



### **Pelican Beach** *The North Sound Area*

Within a good day's distance from Anacortes, Pelican Beach is a great first night out campsite. This site's location is protected from the common southwesterly onshore breezes and has great views of the Cascades and eastern San Juan Islands. 750 foot high Eagle Cliff dominates the north end of the island and is a great spot to view sunsets.

#### *Natural History.*

This Department of Natural Resources site was originally developed through the effort of the Pelican Fleet, owners of small sailboats who cross the channel and haul out on the beach here.
