



## Cascadia Water Trail Campsites

### **Point Robinson** *The Mid-Sound Area*

The Point Robinson light and foghorn mark the southernmost turn in Puget Sound's shipping lanes. The 12-acre Point Robinson complex, now listed on the Washington Heritage Register, features the Coast Guard lighthouse and keeper's quarters. One house can be rented by the week from the Vashon Park District.

#### **Natural History.**

The first fog signal was placed here in 1885, the light added two years later and tended by one keeper. In 1897, the fog whistle blew for 528 hours straight. After using up 35 tons of coal to keep it going, the keeper requested an assistant and, in 1903, a second keeper was added.
