



Cascadia Water Trail Campsites

San Juan County Park *The San Juan Islands*

This is a very popular spot on San Juan Island's west side, where there is little public access to the shore. People flock here, especially during summer months, hoping to spot the whales that frequent Haro Strait. There's much to see with constant boat traffic from Canada and the Strait of Juan de Fuca. Nighttime brings unique views of Vancouver Island.

Natural History.

Low Island, a short distance offshore, is one of 83 San Juan Islands National Wildlife Refuge islands. Black oystercatchers, rhinoceros auklets, glaucous-winged gulls, cormorants, pigeon guillemots, and tufted puffins are a few of the species enjoying the protection of the Refuge. Stay 200 yards away.
